Tham Huai Pom Phi - GPS (TYIS) - 47P 0486675  
(c. 300m SW of road). 1670394

Active resurgence cave c. 1/2 hrs <sup>easy</sup> walk west of RS.  
Follow Huai Mun Sae to <sup>low</sup> ridge + cross over into  
Huai Pom Phi / Huai Pachi. Cave is at head of  
perennial stream.

Easy walking over rocks + flowstone, follow  
streamway up small rapids to divide. Stream  
comes from right + requires swimming to sump.  
Left rises up over rockfalls to hole back down  
to sump pool.

Cave formed along strike of gently dipping bedding  
good chevron folding in limestone 090  
35

Origin of water unknown through ~~the~~ upper  
reaches of Huai Mun Sae is just over ridge. → see  
later

Very interesting fauna - transparent leeches,  
eyeless + white isopods + opilions (uses front  
legs as feelers), colourless mosquitoes / flies  
catfish up to 20cm long in pool at end.

opilions, crickets, 2+ sp. bat, fair amount of  
guano + stream food supply.

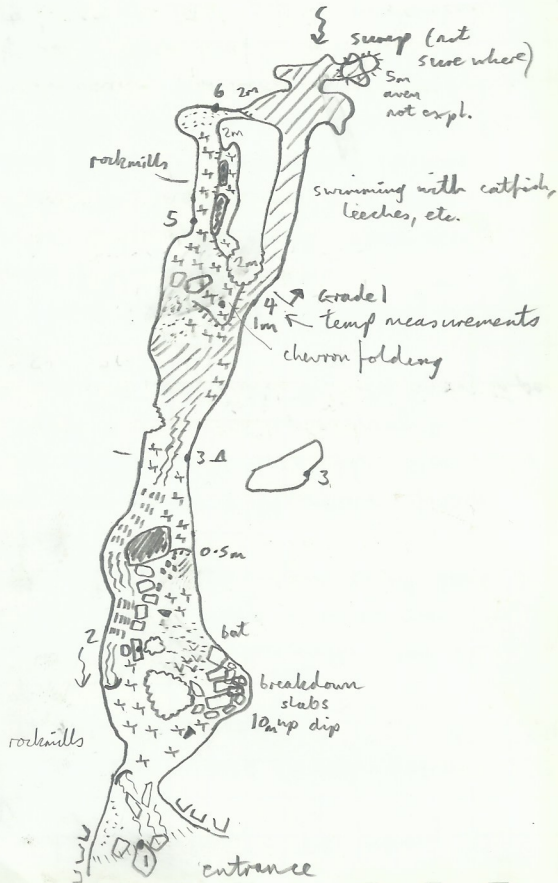
