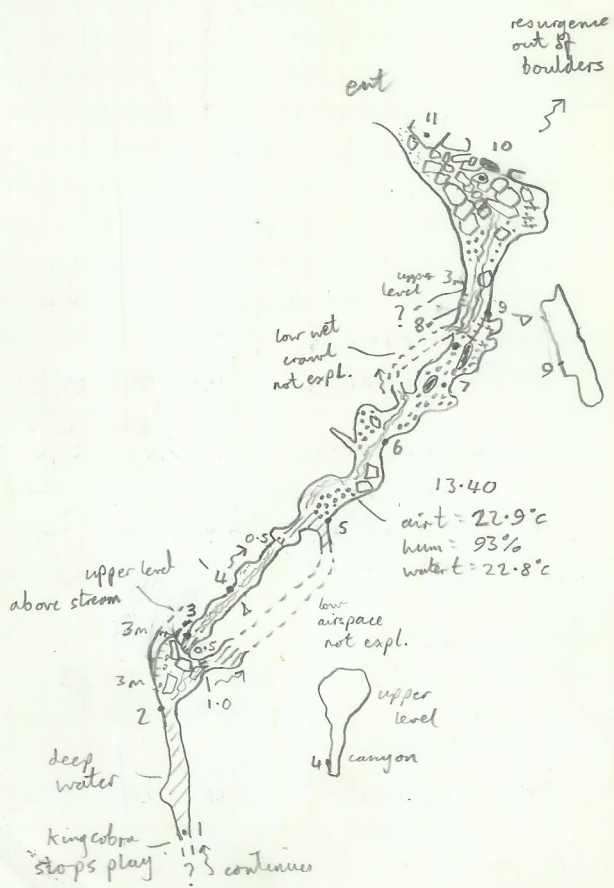
Pass through Ban Kong Mong Tha on track. continue  
for c. 2km with 2 river crossings to fields  
+ dry stream bed. <sup>on North bank. Perennial in boulders</sup> Resurgence is at base of saddle  
in ridge above. Entrance c. 10m up and right of  
resurgence.

Scramble down boulders to stream, which soon  
disappears in low passage to right. <sup>obvious</sup> Dry bypass  
reaches stream again. ~~then~~ and continues to  
junction with  $\frac{1}{2}$  stream appearing from left +  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  from straight ahead. Left has low airspace  
straight down: up short cascades to chamber  
+ full stream. Deeper water in rift ended at  
young King Cobra with passage continuing beyond.  
Probably drains 60m deep doline on other side of ridge.  
Flow rate  $\approx 0.1$  cumec (Apr), catchment size  $6.5 \text{ km}^2$   
underground distance c. 500m, some draughts will  
pass through trap. Needs a return when the snake has  
gone.
