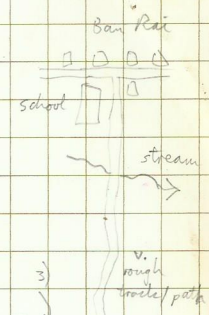

cave is called Tham Nar Tang
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 c. 2km south of Ban Rai.

Cave is formed in ^{bedded} limestone conglomerate. Lot blocks up to 5cm of common, up to 20cm rare. Small qtz pebbles rare, cemented by calcite? some lot pebbles are highly weathered. cave has followed a single bedding plane roof, passages formed downwards along narrow joints. bedding is marked by changes in lithology, finer grained → coarse

On way back to track are a number of small caves

- 1st little more than continuation of bedding roof to other side of valley
- 2) v. low crawl along sandy foil filled bedding
- 3) small shelter.
