



broad spectrum earthquakes  
gap = 5-6cm in column 5-4m column

short but largish, roof c. 15m-20m.,

2 chambers of ancient phreatic origin, domed roofs and flat sed. floors. Small oxbox tubes connect rooms; no sign of porcupine, but a few bats, crickets on guano, spiders, little else. Daylight penetrates most of cave.

near entrance boulder slope is a marine notch along wall. Large bivalve shells encrust roofs + overhangs + another bed with borings. See sketch. Obviously much later modification, also loose mollusc shells + 1 corallite found on floor of entrance chamber

molluscs are concretionary, building up, borings obviously destructive molluscs seem to prefer under side of overhangs but not exclusively (ithellid) seems most important

with shells are dead sea appears to no longer enter
